Her current portfolio includes supporting system of care for early childhood development focused on adapting, implementing and scaling early childhood and caregiver mental health interventions. She served on the Institute of Medicine's *Committee on Clinical Trials During the 2014-15 Ebola Outbreak*, and Johns Hopkins University's Expert Working Group on *Ethics Issues in Public Health Containment for Ebola and other Infectious Diseases*. A member of the *Lancet Commission on Global Mental Health*, she is on advisory boards for the University of Washington's Department of Global Mental Health, and *Intervention*, a mental health journal. From 2010-2018, she was TCC's Country Representative for Health and Mental Health. A native Liberian, she co-led the Mental Health & Psychosocial pillar during the Ebola outbreak. She holds degrees from Harvard, Columbia, and Essex universities and is adjunct faculty at Emory University.
